

Shipbuilding: Industry, Process & Benchmarking Country Selection

Shipbuilding involves construction of ships and floating vessels. It normally takes place in a specialized facility known as a shipyard. In the 20th century, shipbuilding (which encompasses the shipyards, the marine equipment manufacturers, and many related service and knowledge providers) grew as an important and strategic industry in a number of countries around the world.

Historically, the industry has suffered from the absence of global rules and tendencies towards (state-supported) over-investment due to the fact that shippards offer a wide range of technologies, employ a significant number of workers, and generate income as the shipbuilding market is global.

Shipbuilding is therefore an attractive industry for developing nations. Japan used shipbuilding in the 1950s and 1960s to rebuild its industrial structure; South Korea started to make shipbuilding a strategic industry in the 1970s, and China is now in the process of repeating these models with large state-supported investments in this industry. Conversely, Croatia is privatising its shipbuilding industry.

Countries selected for benchmarking Indian shipbuilding sector include **China**, **South Korea** and **Japan**. These three countries contributed to around 65% of global shipbuilding exports of US\$ 174 billion in 2010.7Korea led the pack with contribution of 27% to global shipbuilding exports, closely followed by China with global exports contribution of 23% in 2010. Japan stood third contributing to 15% of global shipbuilding exports in 2010.
